March 20th Our Equinox, also known as Ostara on the Wheel of the Year.

During this time of the year, we celebrate Eostre and Mother Earth. We stand upon the wheel of the year during the time of the Vernal Equinox. The Earth awakens. Sap courses upwards through the trees. Grass begins its greening. Soon flowers shall be fragrant upon the breeze. A new spring is dawning, and so are we. At this time on the wheel of the year, we stand in

perfect balance with the day and the night. As the Sun and the Moon are in balance, so must we strive to be in balance with the world, with our environment, with our deities, with ourselves and with the ones we love. Change is happening now, and we ask for strength and guidance as we move forward on the path laid out before us. Maiden Goddess, soon to be Mother, known by many names. Known as Eostre for more than 2000 years. Eostre the Goddess of Spring. We invite your presence during this time of equal day and equal night. During the time of beginnings, join with us in celebration and rejoicing of the conception of the Son the Sun child who will grow stronger each day until his birth at Yule. Goddess of the Earth, Goddess of all living things, Goddess of the spring, please join with us now.

While Eostre is said to be a Goddess of Spring, fertility, and the dawn; there is truly very little information about Her. Research shows the first mention of Eostre was in the eighth century in 725 CE. According to a Northumbrian monk named Bede, during Eosturmonap, (the equivalent of April), the Pagans celebrated the Goddess Eostre with feasts. We really don't know much about how she was celebrated other than feasts to celebrate spring. While most Gods and Goddesses have many myths and stories surrounding them, this can't be said for Eostre. Easter is named either after Eostre which in turn is thought to be the root word for "to shine or dawn."

Feasts and Fasts around the world!

1st March Shrove Tuesday is a reminder that Christians are entering a season of penance and was originally a solemn day. But over the centuries, in anticipation of the Lenten fast that would begin the next day, Shrove Tuesday took on a festive nature. That is why Shrove Tuesday is also known as Fat Tuesday or Mardi Gras (French for Fat Tuesday). In England pancake races on shrove Tuesday involve running around the block while tossing pancakes!



2nd March – Ash Wednesday – beginning lent – Christian:- Each year, Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent and is always 46 days before Easter Sunday. Lent is a 40-day season (not counting Sundays) marked by repentance, fasting, reflection, ending in the celebration of Easter. The 40day period represents Christ's time of temptation in the wilderness, where he fasted and was tempted by Satan. The symbolism behind the ashes follows the Jewish culture of sprinkling ashes on one's head as a sign of

penance, which was adopted by the Catholic liturgy. The Old Testament (Esther 4:1, Job 42:6, Jonah 3:5-6)describes how the Jews sprinkled themselves with ashes as a customary manifestation of mourning, mortality, conversion, contrition and repentance.





14th March:- Sikh Environment Day is an annual celebration of the Mother Nature by Sikhs around the world. The day, which occurs every March 14th is inspired by the seventh guru of Sikhism, Guru Har Rai, one of the earliest environmentalists in the Indian subcontinent.



16th March Buddhist ; - Soka Gakkai International (SGI) is an international Nichirin Buddhist organisation founded in 1975 by Daisaku Ikeda. It characterizes itself as a support network for practitioners of Nichiren Buddhism and a global Buddhist movement for "peace, education, and cultural exchange."

MAKING A VOW ON MARCH 16 This year marks the 64th anniversary of March 16, 1958, when

second Soka Gakkai President Josei Toda passed the baton of achieving kosen-rufu to the youth. Kōsen-rufu, a phrase found in the Japanese translation of the Buddhist scripture Lotus Sutra, is informally defined to as "world peace through individual happiness." It refers to the future widespread dissemination of the Lotus Sutra.



Daisaku Ikeda - born 2 January 1928) is a Japanese Buddhist philosopher, educator, author and nuclear disarmament advocate



16th/17th Purim - Purim, a joyous one-day Jewish festival that honors an event detailed in the biblical Book of Esther, celebrating the courage of Queen Esther in saving her people from genocide planned by Haman. (What the Jewish people did next gives pause for thought.)



19th March – Hindu Holi - one of the most joyous and widespread Hindu

festivals, taking place over the course of a single day and

night each year between March and April. Often called the "festival of love" or the "festival of Spring", Holi symbolizes the arrival of Spring and the triumph of good over evil. The festival celebrates the eternal and divine love of Radha Krishna.

March 21st Bahai New Year – Nawruz (Persian for new Year) – Bahai will celebrate the annual festival of the spiritual and physical springtime.

March 26th Adinath Swami Jayanti – Jain -. Mahavir Jayanti celebrates the birth anniversary of the 24th Tirthankara Mahavir, who played a significant role in preaching Jainism. Lord Mahavir taught ahimsa or non-violence, satya (truth), asteya (non-stealing), brahmacharya (chastity) and aparigraha (non-



attachment).
